#### Tools for Success: MA 112 and MTH 100

There are several things to know about how to register for the courses MA 112 & MTH 100. If you need the dual classes, you will have to make sure that the section numbers match (ex. MA 112.121 & MTH 100.121). You can check if you have the right section by clicking on the title of a course in the registration system> Course Description. It will tell you if the course section you've chosen is linked to a section of another math course. here's also a possibility that you just need either MA 112 or MTH 100. You can check to see if they are stand alone sections the same way.
